# GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS SERVICE

The mission of the Department of Veterans Service is to serve the more than 776,000 veterans residing in Georgia, their dependents and survivors in all matters pertaining to veterans benefits.

This responsibility falls into two basic tasks: informing veterans and their families about veterans benefits; and directly assisting and advising veterans and their families in securing the benefits to which they are entitled.

To support these missions, the department maintains:

♦ Veterans Field Service Offices: These offices are open Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m. (except on state holidays noted in red throughout this calendar). The Field Service Officers staffing these offices provide direct assistance to veterans at the local level. They counsel and assist veterans in gathering the documents and information required to support their claims. See [veterans.georgia.gov/field-offices](http://veterans.georgia.gov/field-offices) to locate the nearest VFSO.

♦ State Veterans Nursing Homes: These two facilities provide skilled nursing care to Georgia's war veterans who need those services. See the months of January and April for details.

♦ State Veterans Cemeteries: These two locations provide final resting places for Georgia's veterans and serve as shrines to their memory and their service to our nation. See the months of May and December for details.

♦ Veterans Education and Training Division: With Post 9/11 GI Bill oversight for statewide higher education, OJT and apprenticeship programs, this division is responsible for the approval, certification, and supervision of educational institutions and training establishments throughout the state. See the months of March and October for details.

♦ Claims and Appeals Division: The primary function of this division is to assist veterans, their dependents, and survivors in the prosecution of claims for benefits and entitlements available from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and the State of Georgia. Additionally, the division provides support service for claims emanating from the VFSOs.

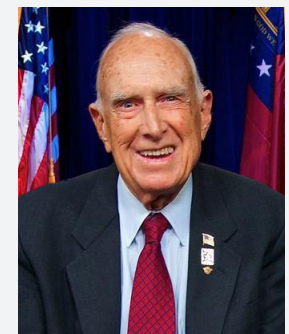
No veterans' benefits are granted automatically – you must apply for them! We exist to help you do exactly that.

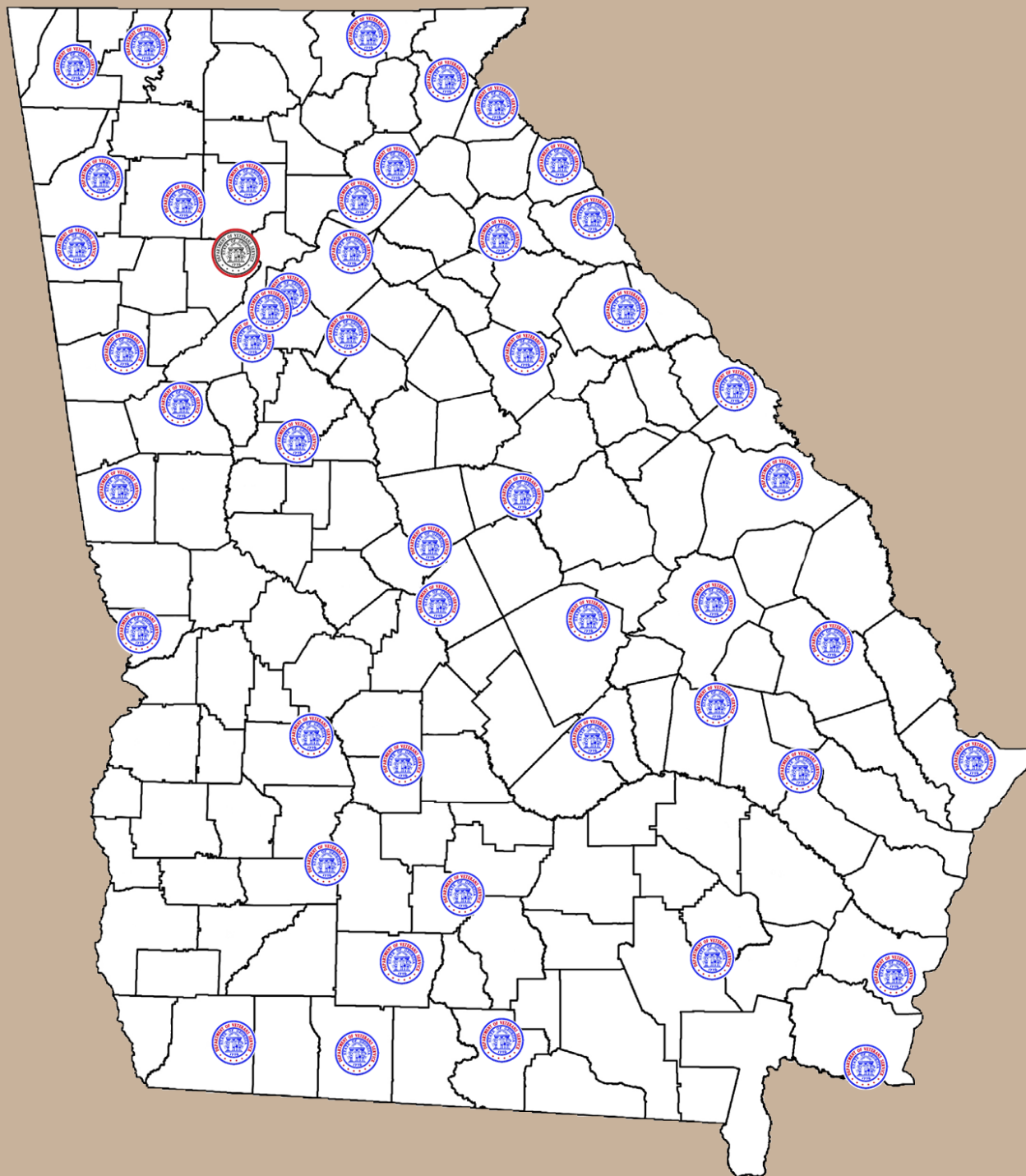

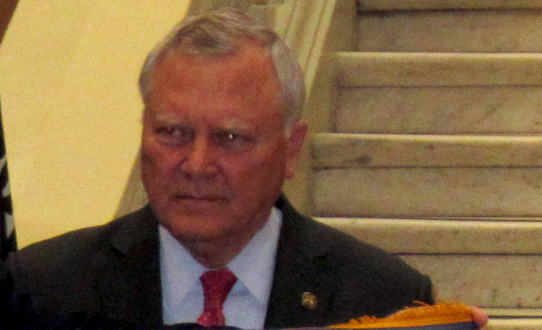

Admission to the homes is on a first-come, first-served basis. The veteran must have been a resident of Georgia for the five years immediately preceding application for admission and must have been discharged or separated under other than dishonorable conditions with service during a period of wartime. Additionally, the veteran's medical situation must be such that it can be managed and treated at the nursing home, and the veteran must be deemed "eligible for care and treatment" according to VA criteria.
